

DF-1710 Software Version 4.13 Release Notes 3/25/04

The following are known issues with version 4.13 of the Digi-Frame® DF-1710 Software. Please check the tech support pages of our website periodically for future upgrades.

- 1) CD-ROM's will not be recognized while in the menu system. Exit to the slideshow to force the CD to be recognized.
- 2) Only JPEG still images can be rotated using the built in "rotation angle" settings. MPEG video, HTML, Flash®, and the menu system do not rotate.
- 3) Cursor movement in the built-in web browser is not working in this release. The web browser can be used to display HTML content but not for interactive browsing.
- 4) WAV audio comments will not play if pause time = 0.
- 5) Menu access may require multiple button presses if pause time = 0.
- 6) Stepping manually past media items may be difficult or impossible if pause time = 0.
- 7) The pause time option must be long enough for web pages to load when viewing HTML content.
- 8) Audio soundtracks of MPEG-4 videos may not play correctly if HTML content has been previously displayed in a slide show. Power cycling the unit is required to restore MPEG-4 audio if this occurs. MPEG-1 audio is unaffected by this issue.
- 9) MPEG-4 video files must have an extension of ".avi" in order to be recognized on removable media (CD-ROM and memory cards). An extension of ".mp4" can be used if the files are sent to the frame via network.
- 10) MacroMedia Flash® support is limited to Flash® 2 features. Flash® 4 files may play if they do not use Flash® 4-specific features. Morphing and vertical anti-aliasing, interleaved (streaming) sound and sound enveloping are not supported in Flash® animations. The Pause Time option must be used to terminate Flash animations
- 11) Stepping manually past a missing media item referenced by a script may require multiple button presses or not work at all.
- 12) It may be difficult to access the menu system during FTP transfers unless the unit is paused. This will be the case if you are running a script consisting of nothing but references to remote URLs and the "nocache" option is specified on those references...
- 13) The "zoom" option for movies encoded at sizes other than 320 x 240 pixels may not make them completely fill the screen, although it will increase their size slightly.
